The Rolex Rankings number 112, established two months prior to this event, will be used for the invitation of athletes.

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According to the Invitation System for the Global Champions Tour (GCT) approved by the FEI Bureau in November 2007

60% of the riders will consist of the riders 1 to 30 on the Rolex Rankings two months prior to the event. In case of riders declining invitations replacements will be selected from the Rolex Rankings in descending order. Riders in this group cannot be lower on the Rolex Rankings than 150th place. Requirements obliging organising committees to invite at least two riders from each NF are to be relaxed;

10% of the participants will be home riders and will be selected from the top 150 riders on the Rolex Rankings. Also included in this group is the FEI Wild Card. The home riders are selected by the home National Federation and the FEI Wild Card by the FEI. Should the Organising Committee (OC) not be able to meet its quota of home riders in this group, the quota will be filled by inviting additional riders from 60% group in descending order as described above.

30% of the participants are selected by the OC. It is not obligatory that these participants be chosen from the Rolex Rankings;

The FEI will apply a certain amount of flexibility in relation to enforcing the rule obliging OCs to have at least 10 NFs represented.

Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.

One groom per athlete.

V. FACILITIES OFFERED (Art. 132, 133)

1. ATHLETES

The competitors will be accommodated (bed and breakfast) in HOTEL VILA ITALIA from 01/07/2010 to 03/07/2010 at the expense of the O.C.

Competitors will be asked for a credit card guarantee for hotel reservation made for them and on their behalf (also for their owners, sponsors, companions)

2. GROOMS

Requests for accommodation must be sent with entries.

Hotels at their own expense.

Meals: One meal per day from 30/6 to 3/7/2010 will be offered by the O.C. on the showgrounds.

OC will provide sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms. These will be regularly maintained in a proper state of cleanliness.

3. HORSES

Transport expenses to be paid by the competitor

For events in Europe, stabling is free of charge. **The stables will be ready from Tuesday 29/6 8 a.m. to Sunday 4/07/2010.**

Horses must be stabled in the boxes assigned to them on the showground.

Horses must not be unloaded on their arrival without the authorization of the Stable Manager.

Stables must be mucked out daily and dirty bedding and rubbish placed in the special containers. At the stable area there are separate waste bins for glass, paper, plastic and dung. Please hand the rubbish in the indicated bins. It is absolutely forbidden to hand the rubbish in the straw or shaving containers. A penalty of 250.000,00 euros will be charged when these rules are not followed per transgression.

The bedding (straw or shaving) and feed for horses is free of charge.

Straw and shavings must be ordered before 1:00 p.m. for the same day delivery and will not be put on the expense note.

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4. ADDITIONAL FEES

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The riders must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition (exception are only possible with the approval of the Ground Jury and the OC).

Bridle according to Art. 260. On order of the OC the riders must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. No prize money will be paid to a rider who does not take part in the prize giving ceremony and/or Press Conferences without being excused by the Ground Jury and the OC.

For the prize-giving ceremony of the Grand Prix and the Press Conference, the riders are obliged to follow carefully the instructions of the OC. Only the 3 best riders of the Grand Prix are invited for the prize giving ceremony. After the prize giving ceremony the 3 best riders have to go immediately to the Press Conference.

The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule.

This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for OCs to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

All payments will be made according to applicable law and tax regulations. Competitors will be asked to provide all necessary information (passport & sofi-number), in order to guarantee a correct tax procedure.

5. INSURANCES

Details pertaining to insurance of athletes, horses etc. Responsibility of OC for damages, fire, theft etc.

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

"The Organising Committee and its commissioners will NOT be responsible for any damage caused by or to competitors, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives." Travelling, residing and participating is at own risk for athletes, grooms, owners and other accompanying persons. Horses travel, reside and compete at athletes'/owners' risk.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 132, 1005)

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owners get passes according to the FEI – General Regulations. The rider will receive 2 passes for the owner per horse and he is responsible for taking care that the owner(s) get the pass.

11. STARTING ORDER AND TIME TABLE

The entries for the next days competitions must be made in the show office 60 minutes after the end of the last competition each day at the latest.

The starting order for the competitions will be as follows:

First competition - special draw

Second and following competitions - rotation

Grand Prix: there will be a draw for the starting order.

The Organising Committee has the right to make changes in the time tables providing the Ground Jury gives its approval.

12. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

13. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

14. TRAINING AREAS WITH PRACTICE OBSTACLES

Are on the show grounds at the athletes disposal. No riding is allowed outside the dimensions of the training areas: Schooling hours on the paddock and competition arena will be communicated by the Chief Steward. The athletes have to follow carefully the instructions of the stewards

15. DOGS

By reason of veterinary order and danger of epidemic, dogs are not allowed on the show grounds.

16. CANCELLATION OF THE EVENT (acc. to Art. 115.1 and 2 of Gen. Reg.).

If special circumstances demand, the Organising Committee reserves the right to take all necessary action including the cancellation of the event, with the approval of the FEI.

17. STABLE SECURITY

The following security regulations of the fire department must be obeyed:

Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable area.

Open fires (ex. camping stoves) are strictly prohibited.

Only the actually needed amount of feed supplies may be stored in the stables.

Open space and entry ways between the stables may not be obstructed by trucks or lorries.

Those who disregard the above security regulations will be reprimanded by the organising committee accordingly and eventually sanctioned by Chief Steward and/or Ground Jury.

XV. VETERINARY MATTERS (art. 280, 1004.2, 1005,1011)

1. HORSE INSPECTION

Wednesday 30/06/2010 from 03h p.m. and Thursday 01/07/2010 from 10h a.m. to 12h.

All horses taking part at this event must be presented during the first horse inspection otherwise they are not permitted to participate.

NEW – EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION

All horses taking part must be vaccinated as per the FEI Vet. Regs. Annex VI (except events taking place in NZL and AUS) updated 1st September 2009.

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
